## Mt. Hakkoda

Mt. Hakkoda refers collectively to the mountain range spanning the north of the Towada Hachimantai National Park which consists of more than ten peaks around the main peak called Mt. Odake. The area is dotted with wetlands and is a treasure trove of alpine vegetation, attracting many hikers from Spring to Autumn. Mt.Hakkoda is also blessed with a high snowfall and has not only ice-covered trees but also ski resorts on a large scale. The Mt.Hakkoda Ropeway, a gondola which can carry up to 101 people at a time, conveys visitors straight to the top of Mt. Tamoyachidake throughout the year.





Hakkoda ski resort is made up of several long ski runs of approximately 3.5km to 5km starting from the peak of Mt. Tamoyachidake which is the location of the ropeway summit station, and can be enjoyed by everyone from beginners to advanced skiers. The scenery is unique to Hakkoda and skiers can enjoy not only ice covered trees covering a large expanse, but also views of Hokkaido in the distance. It is possible to ski from the end of November through to the middle of May, and in some locations Summer skiing is possible in August. Accommodation is available nearby at the famous Sukayu Hot Spring spa, Hakkoda Hotel, Hotel Jogakura, Hakkoda Resort Hotel and Hakkoda Sanso etc.
